As I was being escorted back to my tent after dinner that night, my escort and I bumped into a leopard that was ON the raised walkway. Later during that night, lions were roaring up a storm. The roars were mixed with elephants trumpeting and blaring. It was clear that at the very least, lions were chasing elephants in the dry river channel. The next morning we found that the Marsh Pride had killed an elephant just a few minutes outside of and behind camp; and this happened in the Northern Pride's territory. I later came to learn that this pride was featured in a Natural World/BBC documentary in 2014, called Africa's Giant Killers. The crew is still filming in the area.
