# GORILLA TREKKING IN UGANDA

- There are approximately 900 mountain gorillas left in the world today and an estimated 400 of them reside in Uganda's Bwindi Impenetrable Forest. Currently there are nineteen gorilla families that are habituated and able to be visited on a daily basis.
- Each hike to visit the chimpanzees or gorillas can take anywhere from 4 hours to about 8 hours depending where you find the primates. Some of the hikes can be strenuous so a HIGH level of fitness is required at altitudes of over 5000ft.

Busingye	13 members – one silverback, three adult females, four sub-adult, one juvenile and four

Mucunguzi	8 members - one silverback, three adult females, one juvenile and three infants.	
Kutu	11 members – two silverbacks, two black-backs, three adult females and four infants.	

Based on the Nkuringo side (Kisoro region), southern area of Bwindi there are 3 gorilla families:

#### **GORILLA FAMILIES**

Gorillas are very sociable animals, living in groups of three to thirty. Being sedentary, they are continually looking for food in a living space that is comparatively restricted. They are active only during the daytime and build nests in which they pass the night. The nests built in trees are occupied by the females and young ones, while the males seem to prefer nests on the ground. Their food consists mainly of leaves, buds, tubers and sorts of wild celery from the *umbelliferous* family.

The climb begins through the lower slopes. As the slopes become steeper and rockier, the vegetation becomes thick and tangled; the guides must use their machetes to help clear a path. Huge trees, clinging vines and undergrowth add to the challenge of swift streams and slippery mud underfoot.

Usually at around 8,000 foot signs of the huge animals become apparent. Damage to the vegetation is an obvious sign as the gorillas relish the young tender shoots and break older stems to suck the sap. The smell of gorilla may waft by in the stray breeze or, if one is really near, it is strong and unmistakable. Sounds, which can be remarkably loud crashes or dull reverberating growls of contentment, tell the visitor that the troop is nearby. Once you find them you will have an hour of viewing.

The troop consists usually of a dominant male and up to five or more females and their young. It is basically a stable family with the young only leaving after they reach sexual maturity. Females join another group while young males remain solitary until they have an opportunity of forming their own troop.

Their great size, extraordinary strength and the fact that they live in mysterious forests of luxuriant vegetation, have contributed to the mystique. This primate is of impressive dimensions; some silverback males attain over six feet in height and weigh more than 440 pounds. The head is massive and the huge jaws are equipped with powerful teeth.

Far from being an aggressive animal, as the legends claim, the gorilla is gentle and peaceful in its habits. It is only when threatened that he adopts an intimidating attitude in which he howls in a most frightful way and beats his chest with his fists. Should you find yourself in his presence when he feels threatened, you will be advised to assume a submissive, non-threatening attitude. Once his confidence has been restored, the gorilla goes on about his business accepting you.

Your Guides in Uganda: are carefully selected to bring an excellent knowledge of the areas you will visit and have built up an excellent camaraderie with our clients over the years. As you spend your time on safari with the same guide you maximize seeing and doing "everything" and coming away at the end of a trip with "a friend for life".

#### **Notes:**

- 1) On Day 02, you can fly from Entebbe to Kasese where your guide will meet you and then continue 1.5 hours to Kibable. This eliminates a 5+ hour road transfer. Please request pricing.
- 2) On Day 03 you can choose to spend the day with a chimpanzee researcher and enter the forest in search of chimpanzees. The day will be spent with the researcher learning about their chimpanzee habituation program. To substitute the full-day Chimp Experience in Kibale Forest into the program is \$295.00 per person and is dependent on availability. The chance of seeing the chimps is 96%.
- 3) On Day 04 there is an option to fly from Queen Elizabeth to Bwindi where your guide will meet up with you. Please request pricing.
- 4) Single supplement is based on a minimum of two people traveling.
