Zimbabwe proved to be an ideal place for a photo safari. We were most impressed with the people--happy, friendly and helpful. We quickly learned to shake hands with everyone, even with a thumb twist, and to introduce ourselves...It was nice to be in a place ready for tourists but not over-run by them. We often had areas to ourselves and felt much more like we were enjoying undisturbed nature than places where you see as many people as animals. Your arrangements were thoughtful and thorough. We were met and transferred and felt very welcome and taken care of. One feels very safe in the country and found we didn't need to worry about leaving our possessions in a vehicle or room...Each of the lodges was a unique experience which we enjoyed. Paul Hubbard at Amalinda was of course a fabulous guide especially in the caves, but all our guides were most capable.

Amalinda and Ivory Lodge - Great way to start the trip. At Amalinda, the manager Billy and his staff were warm and welcoming and the hospitality was great. The place itself, as you know, is absolutely stunning in terms of its geolocation and the accommodation was equally beautiful and luxurious.
