All visa information is provided in good faith and is believed to be correct; however, requirements/recommendations can change at very short notice. Visa requirements vary depending on your passport nationality. We keep our visa information up-to-date as much as possible, but rules do change so it is very important that you also check with your local embassy.

Visas are required prior to arrival or may be obtained on arrival, depending on the country being visited.

Please wait for our current visa information specific to your trip to be sent approx. 90 days prior to your departure, as most visas are only valid for 3 months from date of issue. We will provide the cost of the visas, links to online eVisa sites and requirements for non-US/Canadian passport holders.

Passports must be valid for at least 6 months beyond your intended stay and contain sufficient blank VISA pages.

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NOTES:

- **ANTI-MALARIA** – Some form of anti-malaria medication is **STRONGLY URGED**. Anti-Malaria is a tablet not a vaccination and needs a prescription.
- **OPTIONAL VACCINATIONS** - Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Typhoid, Tetanus, Polio and Meningitis
- **YELLOW FEVER** – Southern Africa countries currently do not require proof of the vaccination.

If travelers are arriving into Southern Africa from an endemic area, eg. Kenya and Uganda in East Africa, proof of having the vaccination will be required.

Proof of vaccination is not valid until 10 days after you get the vaccine, so plan to get the vaccine early if you need it.
